Reflection

The Virtue of Hope

When we try to live in solidarity with the pain of the world—and do not spend our lives running from it—we will encounter various forms of “crucifixion.” Pain is physical or emotional discomfort, but suffering often comes from our resistance to that pain. The soul must walk through such suffering to go higher, further, deeper, or longer.

Necessary suffering allows us to grow, but “in secret” (Mark 4:26–29), which is an amazingly common concept, both in the teachings of Jesus and of many of the mystics. Such growth must largely be hidden because God alone can see it and steer it for our good. If we try too hard to understand it, we will stop the process or steer it in the wrong direction.

The virtue of hope, with great irony, is the fruit of a learned capacity to suffer wisely, calmly, and generously. The ego demands successes to survive; the soul needs only meaning to thrive. Somehow hope provides its own kind of meaning, in a most mysterious way.

The Gospel gives our suffering both personal and cosmic meaning by connecting our pain to the pain of others and, finally, by connecting us to the very pain of God. Did you ever think of God as suffering? Most people don’t—but Jesus came to change all of that.

God works best underground and in our unconscious, by rearranging our assumptions and presuppositions—frankly, when we are not in control. The work of grace and healing mostly happens “in secret” as Jesus himself seems to say (Matthew 6:1-13).

Stewardship

St. Paul reminds us of the power of our Baptism and how it is that this sacrament makes us disciples and therefore stewards. We can only love others, and even ourselves truly, if we allow ourselves to be emptied of self-love and filled with God's love. This is why our Lord tells us we must "lose our lives." Putting ourselves or others — even those dearest to us — above God simply cannot give us the ultimate fulfillment and peace of soul that we all want.

But how do we know if we love God more than "father or mother or son or daughter"? Jesus tells us in the next verses. And the fascinating genius of it all is that it is precisely through loving actions towards others, loving them as if they were Christ, that we demonstrate our love for Christ!

So, we have come full circle to the importance of hospitality, and to putting God first in our lives because we have become disciples of Christ through our Baptism. We put God first by serving others as if we were serving Christ Himself, thus losing a self-centered life and finding our true fulfillment.

COVID-19 Protocols

- **Seating in the Church** - Physical Distancing of 2 meters square, only sit where the seats are marked.
- You must record your name and contact details when attending Mass. The attendance sheet is on the table in the foyer.
- We ask that you disinfect and wipe down your own seat, this will assist with the necessary cleaning of the Church (thank you).
- At the sign of peace, acknowledge but refrain from touching.
- The faithful should only receive Holy Communion in the hand, not on the tongue.
- Distribute the Sacred Host only and not the Precious Blood.
- Collection plates will not be passed around during Mass. There are baskets in the foyer for you to place your sacrificial giving. Alternatively, you may like to use one of the electronic methods listed below as your method of giving.
 - Tap & Go, in the foyer
 - Qkr, download the App
 - Direct Debit – contact the parish office
 - Credit Card - contact the parish office
 - EFT that you set up from your bank.

There is to be no singing at Mass until further notice. This includes singing the Gospel Acclamation.

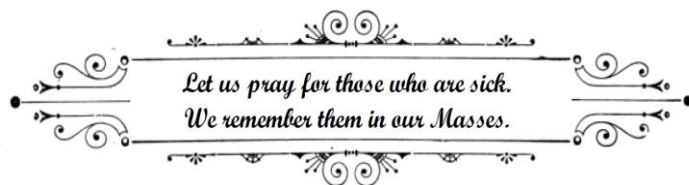
