The Spirit of Truth

We can sometimes regard Pentecost as the day the Holy Spirit came into the world. However, the Spirit had long been active in the world before this event. In fact, even the second verse of Genesis Chapter 1 tells us that the Spirit hovered over the waters. The Old Testament is filled with references in which 'The Spirit of God came upon (him) with power' and the Spirit was evident at Jesus' baptism and throughout the gospels. Jesus is frequently described as being 'filled with the Spirit'. So, from the very beginning of creation the Spirit has moved in the world and continues to energise it today.

The promise of the Spirit of truth points to a continuous revelation and understanding of God's truth beyond what was known during Jesus' earthly ministry. It speaks to the dynamic nature of spiritual enlightenment, where believers are not left to navigate life's complexities alone but are led by the Spirit into deeper truths.

The phrase "complete truth" suggests a comprehensive understanding that encompasses all aspects of divine wisdom and knowledge. It implies that truth is not static but unfolds progressively as individuals grow in their spiritual journey. This aligns with the concept of ongoing revelation within Christian theology, where God continues to unveil deeper layers of truth to those who seek Him.

Understanding spiritual truths goes beyond mere intellectual comprehension; it requires a humble and receptive heart that is open to the Spirit's leading.

Cultivating a relationship with the Holy Spirit, allows the Spirit to illuminate our minds and hearts with the complete truth revealed in Jesus Christ. It invites us to approach truth-seeking not as a passive endeavour but as an active partnership with the Spirit who empowers us to grasp the depth and breadth of God's wisdom and love.

Morning tea will be served in the church foyer following the mass.



Easter Season

Pentecost is a Beginning

Pentecost as it is reported in Acts is the climax of the three-act drama of incarnation. Act one presents various scenes in the ministry of Jesus. Act two is the Passion of Christ. Act three is the triumphant advance of the victorious Lord. As Pentecost "the promise of the Father" was fulfilled (Luke 24:49; Acts 1:4). The ministry, death, and resurrection were not the completion of the promise.

Pentecost is a commencement in the same sense that we use the word to describe a graduation. It is simultaneously climax and beginning. It concludes with the assurance that this is not the end but the beginning. Christ is not dead or absent in some far-off spiritual realm. The kingdom he announced is not set aside to some future millennium but enters a new era of fulfillment. His ministry is not concluded but universalized through his new body. Surely this is part of the good news!
