#### **Open our Hearts**

In today's gospel, we witness a profound moment of healing as Jesus encounters a man who is both deaf and unable to speak clearly. This passage is not merely about physical healing; it is a powerful illustration of the Messiah's mission to restore individuals to fullness of life and community. When Isaiah spoke of the Messiah, he foresaw one who would liberate those isolated by their physical and social conditions, allowing them to rejoin society and live fully. Jesus embodies this prophecy, offering healing that goes beyond the physical and touches the very heart of human dignity and community.

In this specific miracle, Jesus takes the man aside, away from the crowd, and with tender gestures—putting his fingers into the man's ears and touching his tongue—He says, "Ephphatha," which means "Be opened." The man's ears are opened, his speech impediment is removed, and he is restored to full participation in the life of his community.

This act of healing invites us to reflect on what it means to "be opened." Jesus's command is not only for the man who was healed but also for all those witnessing the miracle, and by extension, for us today. We are called to be open in the same way—to have our hearts, minds, and lives opened to the reality of others' needs and sufferings.

In our world, there are many who, like the deaf man, are isolated, not necessarily by physical ailments but by circumstances such as poverty, injustice, prejudice, and loneliness. Jesus's healing of the deaf man is a call to us to open our hearts to these individuals, to respond with compassion, and to actively seek ways to help restore them to a place of dignity and community.

Compassion, in this context, is not just a feeling but a movement towards action. It means allowing our lives to be interrupted by the needs of others and doing what we can to alleviate their suffering. It means being attentive and responsive to the cries of those who are often ignored or marginalized.

As we reflect on this gospel passage, may we hear Jesus's call to "be opened" and allow it to transform us.
