#### The Call to Servant Leadership

James and John are effectively calling 'shotgun' on the best seats at the table! When they ask to sit at the left and right hand of Jesus, they are asking Jesus to name them as his deputies. They're looking to secure for themselves positions of power and authority. Jesus responds by teaching them—and all His disciples—that true greatness in the kingdom of God is not about power or status, but about service. He emphasizes that He Himself came "not to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45).

This passage contrasts sharply with worldly views of leadership. Instead of seeking to dominate, Jesus calls His followers to a path of humility and self-giving love. It echoes the text from Hebrews, which highlights Jesus as our High Priest, one who shares in our struggles and weaknesses. Jesus is not a distant or unfeeling Lord; He is intimately familiar with human frailty and suffering. His leadership is marked by compassion, rooted in the very experiences we go through, and His priesthood is founded on empathy and sacrificial love.

In this context, we are invited to approach Jesus confidently, knowing that He understands our needs and offers grace and mercy. The "throne of grace" mentioned in Hebrews aligns with Jesus' message to His disciples—servanthood and humility grant us access to divine strength. We do not need to fear bringing our struggles before Him because He has walked the path of suffering and offers us both an example and the grace to follow it.

In both the Gospel and the Hebrews passage, the call is clear: discipleship is not about seeking personal honour, but about surrendering to God's will, even in suffering. When we approach Jesus, we find not a distant ruler, but a compassionate High Priest who strengthens us in our weakness, offering mercy when we falter and grace when we most need it. The call to servant-leadership is a challenge, but it is also an invitation to draw close to the One who understands and supports us in every trial.

#### God's Plan for Your Life


Our Gospel today conveys how we are called to imitate Jesus through humility and service.
