Love God First

Jesus presents the greatest commandment: to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. This commandment challenges us to understand love not merely as an act of obedience or gratitude but as something deeper—a love rooted in the very nature of God, not tied to what God does for us.

Loving God first means recognizing God's worth and beauty in God's own right, apart from any blessings, gifts, or interventions we might receive. It calls us to a pure and selfless love that transcends our natural inclinations to love based on what we get in return. In a world often shaped by transactional relationships, this invitation to love God for who God is can feel countercultural. It asks us to adore and honour God not for what we hope to receive but simply because God is worthy of our devotion.

This kind of love requires trust and surrender. It moves us beyond seeking God only in times of need or praising God in moments of abundance. Instead, we cultivate a deep, enduring love—a love that sees God's presence in every circumstance and moments of our lives and acknowledges God's goodness regardless of the shifting tides of our lives.

When we begin to love God for who God is, our relationship with the Divine becomes richer and more intimate. It transforms our hearts, aligning us with God's desires and purposes, and it shapes the way we live. This love becomes the foundation from which we can genuinely love others—not as a duty, but as an overflow of the love we have received and cherished in God. Ultimately, loving God first, purely and wholeheartedly, enables us to live in deeper communion with God and to reflect that love more authentically to the world around us.

Stewardship

Love God and Love your Neighbour

Today's Gospel presents Jesus' teachings on the two greatest commandments. Love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. And love your neighbour as yourself. Let's consider these "greatest commandments" as they relate to three aspects of a Christian steward's daily life — the giving of our time, talent, and treasure.

The use of time refers primarily to our relationship with the Lord — in other words, our prayer life. The use of talents refers to the way I offer the abilities, skills, and interests the Lord has given me for the good of those around me. The use of material gifts — or treasure — likewise demonstrates both love of God and of neighbour. When I trustingly offer a sacrificial gift to God through the offertory collection, I am showing Him in a very tangible way that He comes before all else in my life. When we live for God and others, we are living a stewardship way of life. And like the wise scribe in today's Gospel, we are moving closer to the kingdom of God, our ultimate destination.
