The Poor and Vulnerable

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

10 November 2024

Jesus contrasts the behaviour of religious leaders with the humble offering of a poor widow. This passage not only highlights the exploitation by the religious elite but also serves as a broader critique of an unjust system that preys on the vulnerable, one where the powerful amass wealth and status at the expense of the marginalized.

Jesus criticizes the scribes and their love of public honour and their exploitation of widows—women who, in the social structure of the time, were among the most vulnerable. This passage highlights the ways in which institutional corruption infiltrates religious, political, and social systems, distorting them for personal gain. The critique here is not just about individuals but about a systemic injustice that values power and wealth over human dignity and care.

The scene shifts to the temple treasury, where many rich people give large sums, and a poor widow offers two small copper coins. The widow's act can be seen as a prophetic condemnation of the system that has failed her. The system is designed to sustain itself through the wealth and power of the elite, while the poor are left to sacrifice everything, often in vain.

The widow's gift is heroic in its faith and trust in God, but her situation should challenge us. Rather than a great act of generosity, we can now see the widow's payment of Temple tax as a burdensome, heartwrenching obligation to pay the very last coins she had to a corrupt, uncaring system. It raises questions about our current structures that allow wealth inequality and social injustice to persist.

This gospel invites us to reflect on how we can be agents of change in dismantling such systems of exploitation and oppression. It calls for a preferential option for the poor, challenging us to actively confront political and social structures that maintain inequality. Like Jesus, we are invited to expose the hypocrisy of systems that fail the marginalized and to create communities rooted in justice, mercy, and compassion. Jesus says, is yours the disposition of the apostles, my child? The more closely you seek to follow their example, the more good you will do to souls. Souls are not saved "by persuasive words of human wisdom" (1 Cor, 2:4), but by the influence of virtue and the effectiveness of grace. If people run away from sacrifice, seek their own comfort and make no effort to become holy, how will they be effectively able to invite others to practise virtue?

So work at your improvement; make generous efforts to grow continuously in virtue. Then what you say and do will be useful in obtaining for your neighbour all the good you want for him.

Faith-filled generous stewards

Today's First Reading from the First Book of Kings, as well as the Gospel passage from Mark, both centre on the actions of two seemingly poor and helpless widows who show themselves to be faith-filled and generous stewards.

In the eyes of the world, particularly in biblical times when there was no life insurance or Social Security, these widows were weak and dependent on others to take care of them. They each found themselves in desperate situations — one in the midst of famine with a child for which to care, and the other clearly impoverished. Yet, each demonstrated strength and generosity that distinguished them from those around them. These women saw themselves as stewards, not owners, of the resources God gave them, regardless of how much or how little they had.
