The Prodigal Father

Luke presents one of Jesus' most well-known parables, often called The Parable of the Prodigal Son. Yet, this title only tells half the story. The deeper irony of the passage is that it is not only the son who is prodigal—wastefully extravagant—but also the father, in a way that mirrors God's abundant and limitless grace.

The younger son's prodigality is obvious. He demands his inheritance prematurely, essentially wishing his father dead, and then squanders it on reckless living. His extravagance leaves him destitute, feeding pigs—a striking image of his spiritual and social degradation. However, when he reaches rock bottom, he comes to his senses and decides to return home, rehearsing an apology that acknowledges his unworthiness.

The father's response, however, is even more shocking than the son's initial wastefulness. Instead of rebuking or demanding repayment, the father runs to meet his son—a culturally undignified act for a man of his stature. He embraces him before a word of apology is spoken, robes him in dignity, and throws a lavish feast. This is prodigal love: a love that is reckless in its generosity, extravagant in its mercy, and boundless in its welcome.

The elder son, however, struggles with this abundance. He sees the father's mercy as unjust, refusing to enter the feast. He has been dutiful, obedient, and hardworking—yet, in his resentment, he too is lost, though in a different way. His struggle reveals how difficult it can be to accept grace when we believe it must be earned.

At its heart, this parable is about God's prodigality—His wastefully extravagant love that is given freely, not based on merit, but on His own overflowing compassion. Whether we see ourselves in the younger son, lost in sin and self-inflicted suffering, or in the elder son, resentful of grace given to others, the invitation is the same: to enter the feast of God's mercy.

God's love is never measured, never rationed, never earned. It is prodigal—lavish beyond reason. The question remains: will we accept it?
